#### Be Winter Wise – Sign Up For Parking Restriction Email Notification

Each year, the City implements parking restrictions in problematic and steep areas. This help roads crews keep streets clear, making them safer for winter driving during snow events. These restrictions are activated when snow is in the forecast until streets are clear again.

This way you will know when parking restrictions are activated in your area, avoiding costly tickets or having your vehicle towed:

- Corona Crescent in the Chineside area
- Hamber Court and Pritchett Place
- Lansdowne Drive
- Westwood Plateau: Berkshire Crescent, Braeside Place, Chartwell Green, Firestone Place, Johnson Street (above David Ave.), Norwood Court, Parkway Boulevard (from Panorama Drive to Plateau Boulevard), Pinetree Way (above David Ave.), Plateau Boulevard, Topaz Court and Turnberry Lane
