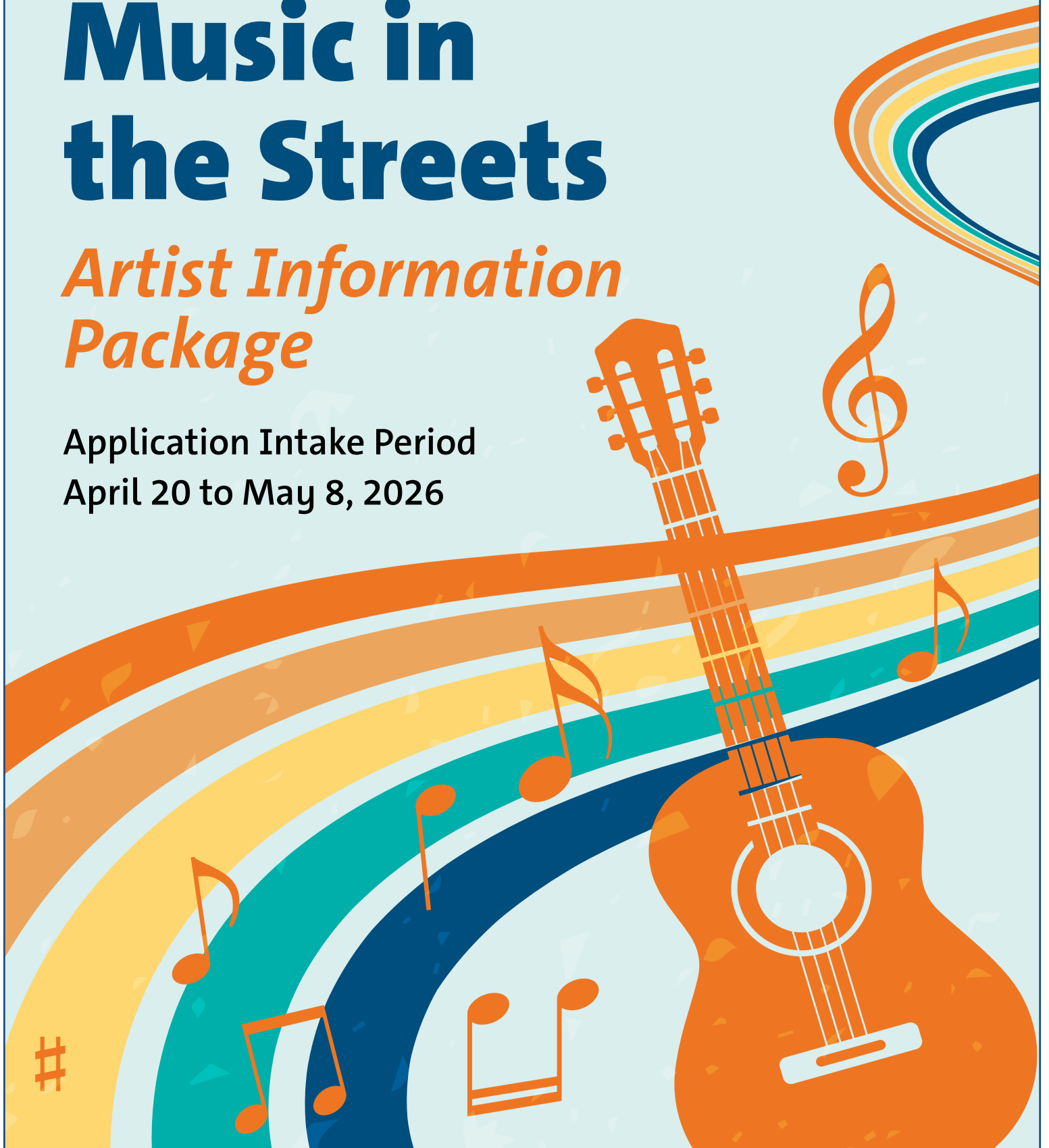

Thank you for your interest in being a part of the City of Coquitlam's 2026 Music in the Streets program.

Please read the information below regarding the Call for Musicians Entries and submit an Application Form by May 8, 2026 at 11:59 p.m.

Music in the Streets

The City of Coquitlam is looking for solo and duo musicians to perform in four public spaces this summer. With the recently enhanced public spaces from the Streetscape Enhancement Program, the City is looking to activate these spaces with live musical performances.

The goal of the Music in the Streets program is to create vibrancy in public spaces and showcase the talents of local musicians.

Rules for Entries

- Applications will be accepted from musicians living in Metro Vancouver, with priority given to those from Coquitlam and the Tri-Cities.
- Applicants must submit a live performance video link.
- Musicians can apply as a solo artist or duo.
- Applications are open to any emerging or professional musicians, aged 19 and up.
- Accepted musicians from the previous year's program are eligible to apply, however preference may be given to those who have not been part of the program previously.

Selection Criteria

- Preference will be given to Coquitlam or Tri-City based musicians.
- Past experience as an emerging or professional musician.
- Previous experience performing in public spaces and engaging with the public.
- Availability to perform two to three performances between June and August.

Selection Process

A selection panel formed from the Cultural Services Advisory Committee will be guided by City staff, based on the selection criteria and will contact musicians directly if they are selected. Non-selected applicants will also be notified.

Accepted Artists

Selected artists will be required to enter into a Performers Agreement with the City that includes but is not limited to the following:

- Performer must be responsible for providing your own battery-powered amplification.
- Performer must be covered by insurance; the cost and coordination of the insurance will be provided by the City.
- Performances must be family friendly and appropriate for performing in public.
- Performer will be asked to sign a Photo Release Form allowing the City of Coquitlam to take and use photos of them and/or video of them performing their music.
- Perform according to all City bylaws, including noise bylaws.
- Performances are weather dependent, if canceled due to bad weather, the performance date will be rescheduled to a mutually agreeable date.

Payment

The City agrees to pay the performer, \$300.00 CAD for the performance. Performers will need to fill out a vendor profile application and EFT form. Payment will be issued 30 days post date of receiving the performers invoice.

Performances

Performances will take place between June 2026 and August 2026. Performers will be asked to perform an hour and half set, with a 15 minute break in-between.

Designated Performances Spaces

The City has identified four performance spaces within Coquitlam. Temporary vinyl decals will be placed on the ground to indicate where musicians will be performing. On the application, performers can list their preferred location but there is no guarantee of what location will be assigned.

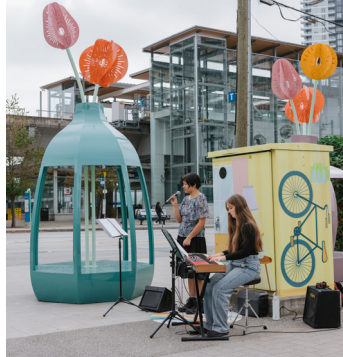

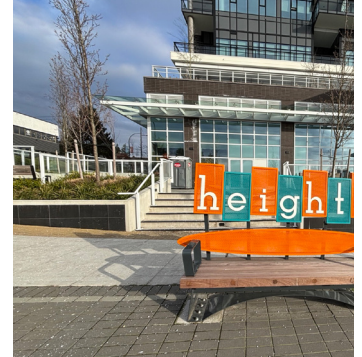
