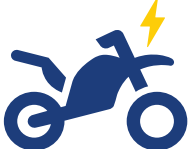


Micromobility

Know the Rules Before You Ride

Not all small or electric vehicles are treated the same under the Motor Vehicle Act.
Misunderstanding the differences can result in fines or vehicle seizure.

Vehicle Type	Where can I ride?	How old I need to be?	How fast can I go?	License and insurance?	What else should I know?
 E-bike	Anywhere where bicycles can ride	14+ for light e-bikes; 16+ for standard e-bikes	Light e-bikes: max. speed 25 km/h Standard bikes: max. speed 32 km/h	No driver's licence or insurance required	Must have fully operable pedals
 E-Scooter	Only in communities participating in the pilot project	16+	max. speed 25 km/h	No driver's licence or insurance required	Illegal outside of pilot communities
 Moped/LSM	On public roadways only	16+	max. speed 70 km/h	Driver's Licence and insurance required	Canadian Motor Vehicle Safety Standards (CMVSS) compliance label required
 E-Dirt Bike	Not on roads, sidewalks, bike lanes, fields, greenways nor in parks	Not legal at any age on public roads	Not permitted on public roads	Cannot be registered or insured	Not legal e-bikes or limited-speed motorcycles
 Mini-Motorcycle	Not on roads, sidewalks, bike lanes, fields, greenways nor in parks	Not legal at any age on public roads	Not permitted on public roads	Cannot be registered or insured	Do not meet safety standards
