Metro Vancouver Requirements

Metro Vancouver enforces the regional air quality management bylaw requirement that a business, including agricultural operations, obtain an Open Burning Approval prior to conducting an open burn. You can download that Application at: coquitlam.ca/openairburning

This enforcement seeks to reduce harmful emissions from open-air burning of vegetative matter, including fine particulate matter, carbon monoxide, nitrogen oxides, volatile organic compounds, black carbon, and small amounts of toxins. Metro Vancouver Open Burning Approvals include requirements to ensure that businesses burn in a manner that minimizes these harmful emissions.

In addition, businesses are required to demonstrate that they have considered alternative methods of disposal as part of the application process.

You must check and only burn when Metro Vancouver's "Open Burning Advisory" indicates that burning is allowed. Links and details can be found at: coquitlam.ca/openairburning.

It shall be the sole responsibility of the permit holder to ensure compliance with the provisions of the Fire Prevention and Life Safety Bylaw No. 3712, 2005 and amendments thereto, and any other applicable federal, provincial or municipal statutes, regulations or bylaws. A copy of this permit shall be kept on the premises for the duration of the fire.

NOTWITHSTANDING THE ABOVE, THE PROPERTY OWNER IS RESPONSIBLE FOR COMPLYING WITH ALL APPLICABLE FEDERAL, PROVINCIAL, REGIONAL AND LOCAL ENVIRONMENTAL LAWS AND REGULATIONS
