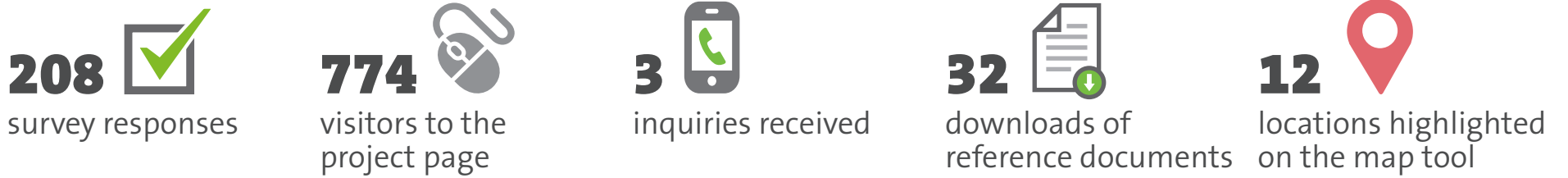
What We Heard

How Residents Engaged

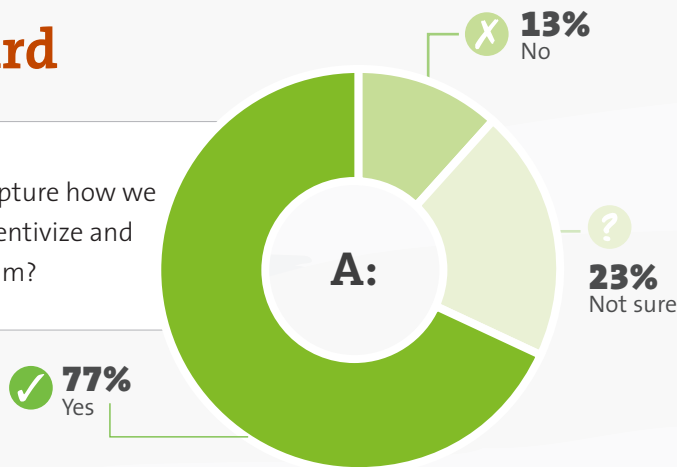

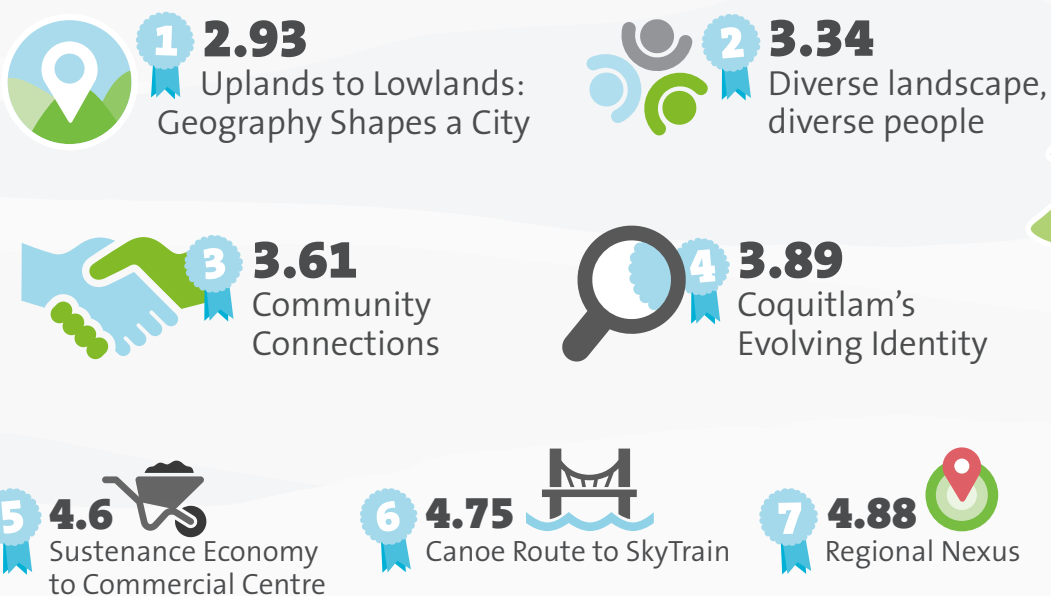
Q:

Does this proposed **vision** capture how we should assess, recognize, incentivize and preserve heritage in Coquitlam?



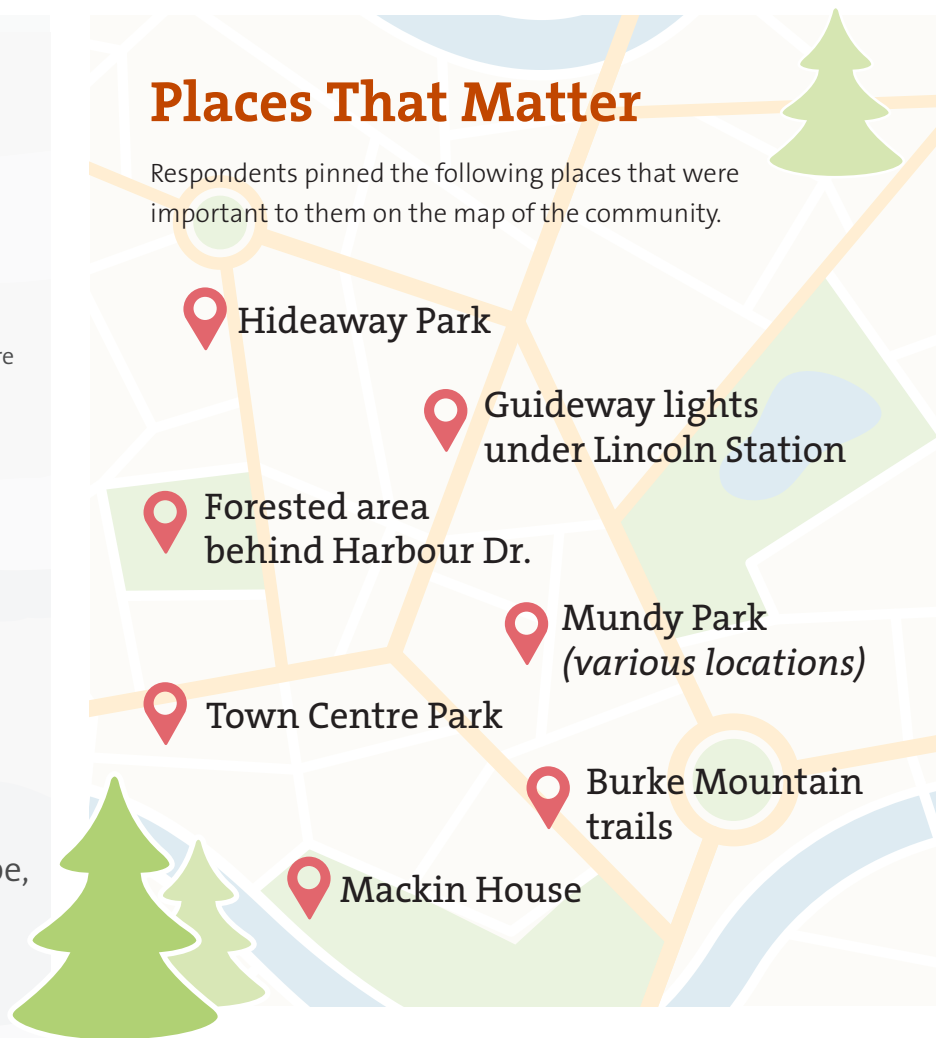
We asked respondents to weigh in on **seven draft heritage themes**, designed to highlight the core aspects of Coquitlam's identity and evolution.
